

This is a message we must carry to those around us who desperately need to hear it. Even in comparatively wealthy countries—perhaps especially so—the spiritual need is dire. Christians must follow the example of Jesus and bring the good news of salvation to the spiritually poor and needy. The kingdom of God is near, and the time grows shorter every day.

We are still needing an individual or two that will oversee this ministry. Talk to Pastor Kevin to take hold of the reins.


Blood Drives
